- Recertification Tests: \$28 each (\$56 each for L1 and L2) up to \$74 maximum. The \$74 maximum limits only how much you pay, not the number of recertification tests you may take. It does not include the Registration Fee.

The National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) was founded by the automotive service industry in 1972 with the mission to improve the quality of automotive service and repair through the voluntary testing and certification of automotive professionals.

Important Registration Information

REGISTER EARLY! Test Centers are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. If the Test Center(s) you request is full or unavailable, we will assign you to an alternate location.

ADMISSION TICKET: After submitting your Registration Form, you should receive an Admission Ticket showing the tests for which you are registered and the exact location where your tests will be given. You will be required to show a current (unexpired) government- or school-issued photo ID at the Test Center. The name you use to register must match the name on your current photo ID. ASE/ACT will begin mailing Admission Tickets in early September.

Call the ASE Help Desk at 1-800-388-5584 by October 8, 2010 if:

- you submitted your registration by September 30 and you have not yet received an Admission Ticket, or
- you wish to make changes and/or correct an error on your Admission Ticket.

EMPLOYERS: When registering by mail, send all registration forms in a single envelope with one check for all fees. If you are paying for tests and a registrant leaves your employ, ASE cannot cancel the registration or substitute another person. Requests for test fee credits must be made in writing and will only be honored if the registrant is absent from the testing. The Registration Fee cannot be credited.

MISSED TEST FEE CREDIT: Once you submit your registration, it cannot be cancelled. If you miss one or more tests, you may request a credit of your test fees. When you open a test book at the test center, you are considered to be present and not eligible for a credit for that test. The Registration Fee cannot be credited.

Your test fee credit can be applied to the Spring 2011 written testing session, but you must submit a new registration request and pay any additional fees. Credit requests must be received before a new registration request, or they will not be honored. Any unused credit will expire at the close of registration for the Spring 2011 ASE tests.

The test fee credit is issued to the party who paid (you or your employer) and is applied to any outstanding balances first. Employers will be sent credit vouchers by e-mail or fax when the credit request is processed. To use the credit, the voucher information must be included with the new registration request.

To request a credit, mail your Admission Ticket to ASE, P.O. Box 4007, Iowa City, IA 52243. If you do not have your Ticket, mail a written request. All credit requests must be received by December 31, 2010.

PAYMENT BY CHECK: Your check may be converted into an electronic funds transfer. The funds may be withdrawn from your account the same day your check is received. You will not receive a cancelled check; the payment will be shown on your regular statement. If the check is not honored due to insufficient funds, it may be re-presented electronically up to two more times.

NOTICE OF TEST RESULTS: About four weeks after you take ASE exams you will receive by mail a detailed score report. If you pass and have satisfied the work experience requirement, you will be mailed your ASE credentials a few weeks later. Test results cannot be released over the phone or via e-mail. Failure to make full payment will result in ASE withholding test results.

PRIVACY POLICY: We will not release test scores over the telephone or via e-mail. We also will not report your individual test scores to anyone else unless we receive a written request from you. ASE does reserve the right to confirm whether you do or do not hold ASE certification and in which area(s). ASE will, at its discretion, use your records to communicate with you, or to facilitate communications by others with you, about education, training, and awards programs, as well as future tests and offers.

RE-TAKING TESTS: If you miss or fail a test, you may retake it during future test periods, but you must register again and pay the appropriate registration and test fees. ASE further requires that you wait at least 45 days after you fail a test before you can take it again. (This allows time for training and practice.) If you register and take the same test twice in less than 45 days, your second score will be cancelled and all fees will be forfeited.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the Tests like?

ASE certification tests are written to measure the knowledge of diagnostic and repair skills necessary for competent job performance. Experienced professionals who work daily on the vehicle systems covered will find the test questions job-related.

Test questions are written by a panel of technical service experts from vehicle manufacturers, repair and test equipment and parts manufacturers, plus working technicians and educators. All questions are first pretested on a national sample of test-takers.

Who may take ASE Certification Tests?

You may take the regular tests as long as you are registered by the deadline and have paid the proper fees. Note that some tests (L1, L2, X1) have prerequisites—see Test Series, pages 15–16. You will be certified if you pass one or more tests *and* satisfy the hands-on work experience requirement.

May I register for more than one test?

You may register for as many as four regular tests on one day. The time allotted on each test date is four hours, enough time to take more than one test. (We recommend that you attempt no more than 225 questions per test session.)

What happens at the test center?

Arrive early enough to park and find the appropriate building and room location. You should report for check-in by 6:45 p.m. Testing is scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m.

Bring your current (unexpired) government- or school-issued photo ID (it is required for admission), your admission ticket, several No. 2 pencils, and an eraser. Books, calculators, cell phones, and other reference material will not be permitted in the test room. Exception: Printed English-Foreign dictionaries, which will be inspected before and after testing, are allowed.

You will receive test book(s) for those test(s) printed on your Admission Ticket and an answer folder. The supervisor will explain how to fill out the answer folder. The test sessions are timed. If you finish early, you may leave during dismissal periods.

When do I take Recertification Tests?

Certification credentials are valid for five years. If it has been over four years since you took a particular test(s), it is time to register for the corresponding Recertification Test(s). All (except L1 and L2) are about one-half the length of the regular tests.

If you have some certifications that are due to expire soon and others that are still good for some time, you may take recertification tests for any or all of them.

If you recertify early, you will not be credited with the time remaining on your original certification(s). The new expiration date is five years from the date of your recertification.

May I take the Recertification Tests even if I have let my ASE certifications lapse?

Yes, you may take the Recertification Tests even if you are expired in a specialty area. You simply must have previously passed the corresponding regular test. Exceptions: Tests L1, L2, and X1 have special requirements. See Test Series, pages 15–16.

May I take the regular tests to recertify?

When you sign up to renew your certifications, you are automatically assigned the recertification versions of the tests. If you prefer, you may take the regular tests instead; you will, however, have to pay at the regular test rate. Contact the ASE Help Desk at 1-800-388-5584 or send an e-mail to asehelp@act.org if you would like to take regular tests.

I have a Master Technician certificate, but some of the test areas have expired. Am I still considered to hold Master status?

No. You earn Master status when you achieve certification in all of the required testing areas. You must keep each one of those certifications current in order to maintain it. If your Master status is lost because one or more of the required certifications has lapsed, it can be reinstated by simply taking and passing the necessary recertification tests.

Are any tests offered in bilingual format?

Yes. Regular tests for A1, A4, A5, and A6 are offered in English/Spanish bilingual format. No special registration is needed for bilingual tests. More information is available at www.ase.com. Click on “Español.”

How To Register—Fall 2010 ASE Tests

- You may register by mail, telephone, or online, but register only once. Once you submit your request, ASE cannot cancel it or substitute another person.
- Registration Forms and Fees must be received at ASE in Iowa City, Iowa, by September 30, 2010. (To prevent delays, do NOT mail to ASE in Leesburg, Virginia.)
- If you do not receive your Admission Ticket within two weeks of submitting your registration, call the ASE Help Desk at 1-800-388-5584.
- Any processing after the close of registration may incur a \$35 late fee per person.
- ASE/ACT cannot be responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

Work Experience Requirement

ASE requires that you have two or more years of full-time, hands-on work experience either as an automobile, truck, truck equipment, school bus or transit bus technician; service consultant, parts specialist, engine machinist; or as a collision repair, refinishing, or damage analysis and estimating technician for certification, except as noted below. If you have not previously provided work experience information, you will receive a Work Experience Report Form with your Admission Ticket. You must complete and return this form to receive a certificate.

Important Notes:

- Experience as a repair technician does not satisfy the separate experience requirements for Collision Damage Estimator (test B6), Automobile Service Consultant (test C1) or Parts Specialist (tests P1 through P4, P9).
- You may take tests (except L1, L2, and X1) before you have two years of experience. You will receive a score report, but you will not earn certification or receive certificates until you fulfill the experience requirement.

Substitutions for work experience. You may receive credit for up to one year of the two-year work experience requirement by substituting relevant formal training in one, or a combination, of the following:

High School Training: Two full years of training, either in automobile/truck/school bus repair or in collision repair, refinishing, or damage estimating, may be substituted for one year of work experience.

Post-High School Training: Two full years of post-high school training in a public or private trade school, technical institute, community or four-year college, or in an apprenticeship program may be counted as one year of work experience.

Short Courses: For shorter periods of post-high school training, you may substitute two months of training for one month of work experience.

You may receive full credit for the two-year work experience requirement with the following:

Completion of Apprenticeship: Satisfactory completion of either a three- or four-year bona fide apprenticeship program.

To have your training considered as a substitute for work experience, send an official transcript of courses, a statement of training, or a certificate showing satisfactory completion of apprenticeship with your Work Experience Report Form. Documents should show length of training (hours or weeks). ASE reserves the right to evaluate all requests for substitution of training for experience and to grant such credit as may be appropriate. The Institute also reserves the right to verify any reported work experience through employers and others.

Work experience other than that described above also may be credited toward fulfillment of the two-year experience where, in ASE's judgment, the nature of the experience so warrants.
